Auxiliar: WILL/WON'T

- Used for predictions
- Used for offers
- Decisions made at the moment

BE + GOING TO

- Used to express planned events or intentions
- Used for future predictions based on physical (usually visual) evidence.

Present continuous

- Used for planned or personally scheduled events.

Use will-future, going to-future or Present continuous
