

Frequency Adverbs

<p>Other Verbs (play, do, study, work, etc.)</p>	<p>Frequency Adverbs come BEFORE other verbs.</p> <p>I <u>always</u> help the other students. My brother <u>usually</u> comes late to school. Jenny and Susan <u>often</u> study in the library after class.</p>
<p>BE Verb (am, is, are, was, were, etc.)</p>	<p>Frequency Adverbs come AFTER a BE verb.</p> <p>I <u>am</u> always a good student. My brother <u>is</u> usually late to school. Jenny and Susan <u>are</u> often in the library after class.</p>
